For over 60 years **PETER FORTIN** has played a wide variety of finger-picking styles and strumming patterns, from traditional folk, rhythm and blues to soft rock in a variety of venues across Canada. He enjoys covering songs from Gordon Lightfoot, Bob Dylan, The Band, John Prine, Pete Seeger, Arlo Guthrie, Leonard Cohen, Simon and Garfunkel, James Taylor, Jim Croce, McCartney and Lennon and many others. During the late 70's, he wrote and recorded his own material with a wonderful group of musicians in London, Ontario. As a balladeer and storyteller, he loves the moment-to-moment intimate connection with a live audience.

Originally from Montreal, **VIRGINIA DIPIERRO** now makes her home in Cornwall. Our audience may remember her performance a couple of seasons ago with her trio Llawnroc. This time she is back at the Tilted Steeple for a solo set in which she will celebrate the 10th anniversary of an album she recorded with her former group, Virginia's Folly, entitled *The Wreck of the Lucy Walker*. HA' LOONIE is a local folk-bluegrass trio made up of Tony Glen, Rachele Eves, and Harmony Koiter. They have been playing together for nearly two years in open mic venues, living rooms, outdoor parties, bluegrass camp stages, all night jams, church halls, and the warm summer streets of SD&G. Community theatre brought them together as friends, while their passion for expression and interplay between instruments helped evolve the three-piece into a joyous and thoughtful force. With a focus on the nuances and beauty in the spaces between each sound, their sets tend to create a mood and invoke a sense of journey or storytelling.

This is **TED GUTHRIE's** fourth season as Tilted Steeple's sound man, for which we are most grateful. A retired Lutheran priest currently serving as Honorary Associate Priest at St. Paul's Anglican Church in Brockville, Ted worked for over 20 years in correctional and mental health chaplaincy, where he had many opportunities to lead group hymn singing and popular music singalongs. He played in a rock band in high school and performed at coffee houses on campus in the late 60s. These days he is regularly seen at Brockville's *Saturday Night Live* open mic evenings, in addition to being an annual guest of the Tilted Steeple Coffee House. This month Ted will be closing the show and leading the audience participation number.
