THREE FOR THE SHOW is a trio made up of Ken Julien, Cholly Boland and Anne Lyon. Hailing from Kemptville, Ken is a singer/songwriter as well as an avid hunter and arborist. He is currently recording a CD of his original songs. Cholly comes from a music-teaching family and has played in bands and sung in choirs for many years, performing at such events as the Ole Towne Hall Christmas Show and the Dairyfest Gospel Fest. In his leisure time he is also President and Chief Executive Officer of the Winchester District Memorial Hospital. Anne works as a nurse and Pastoral Care Coordinator at WDMH. A member of the Good News Singers Music Ministry for 20 years, she has recorded two Gospel CDs.

MICHAEL LEWIS is a retired teacher currently living in Brockville with early roots in folk music, but also into rock and jazz, musicals, church choirs and barbershop quartet singing. After teaching in a French private school on Montreal's South Shore, he worked at the Kahnawake Survival School, then as Centre Director with the Cree School Board in Waswanipi, Quebec. In 2006, with three children aged 5, 8 and 10, he walked the Camino de Santiago from LePuy en Velay in France to Santiago de Compostela in Spain. The nearly four-month pilgrimage with two Pyrenean donkeys, camping gear and five instruments allowed him to teach his

children how to meet and interact with people from various cultures, with evening concerts to entertain the weary pilgrims. After the pilgrimage, the Lewis family travelled around Europe in a Westfalia, bringing home a wealth of friendships and experiences.

LÉO BÉRIAULT began singing and playing guitar at a very early age. His father played fiddle from the age of nine, and a brother had a successful musical career playing guitar and singing. Since his early 20's, Léo has enjoyed listening to and performing the popular rock and roll and country songs of the day. Léo started the *Easy Country Band* in the early 1980's, which performed at live events until around 2000. Today, he still enjoys plugging in a guitar and singing his favourite songs. We are delighted to welcome him to the Tilted Steeple for the first time, joined by his sons Mario on kahone and Alain on electric bass.
