RANDY LACEY and **GREG PREST** have known each other for decades through their significant others, and when together they usually play popular music that everyone knows, while sitting around a campfire or Christmas dinner. **Randy** has been playing guitar for longer than he cares to admit, mostly folk, rock and the blues, while also dabbling in classical. **Greg** has a music degree from McGill University. He taught music at North Dundas District High School, where he spent 16 years leading the concert bands and jazz bands to Gold level standings in Music Festivals in Canada and the U.S. He also sang with the Cantata Singers in Ottawa performing Handel's *Messiah* with the NAC orchestra every year. Randy & Greg are joining forces this month to play a set of classical guitar.

MARGARET WHISSELLE is a Queen's University Bachelor of Music graduate who has been teaching piano/voice/theory and performing in the Morrisburg area for over 30 years. She accompanies the Seaway Valley Singers community choir and is Organist/Choir Director at both Iroquois Pastoral Charge and Lakeshore Drive United Churches. She has performed in and accompanied numerous musical productions, and most recently played the role of Bloody Mary in the Brockville Operatic Society's presentation of *South Pacific*. **SAM MOSS** is a lifelong area resident who grew up in a musical family and was singing in a church choir before he could read and singing solos in Kinsmen music festivals as a young boy. He recently rediscovered the joy of singing, taking vocal lessons with Margaret and joining the Seaway Valley Singers.

Bill Lalonde has specialized in the art of storytelling for close to 17 years. He weaves stories from traditional and contemporary folk tales as well as from his own original anecdotes and family lore. Bill is a member of the 1000 Island Yarnspinnners, Storytelling Toronto, and the Storytellers of Canada. He has appeared at the Festival of Storytelling in Toronto, the Ottawa Children's Festival, and on NPR.

PLAIN FOLK is the group made up of **Isabelle Delage**, the organizer and host of the Tilted Steeple Coffee House, and her bandmates from Montreal, **Mick Perreault** and **Val Teodori**. Together they perform some of Isabelle's original material along with other songs, mostly from the Canadian folk repertoire. Originally from Montreal but now making her home in Morrisburg, Isabelle is a singer-songwriter and the mother of "five-to-six children", who draws her inspiration from daily life, writing songs that tell a story about life, love, loss and hope. She has recorded three CDs, two with Plain Folk and a solo CD whose title track, *The Inundation*, is based on the story of the Lost Villages.
