ÆTERNAL marks 26 years of ministry in 2023. HA' LOONIE is a folk trio based in North Dundas, made up of **Tony Glen** (guitar), Rachelle Eves (ukelele and fiddle), and Harmony Koiter (harmonica and percussion). Community theatre brought the trio together as friends, while their passion for expression and interplay between instruments helped evolve the three-piece into a bright and thoughtful force. With a focus on vocal dynamics and elements of theatrical playfulness, and blending elements of celtic, reggae, country, pop, and blues, the group entices audiences with fresh takes on classic hits, digs into obscure traditional numbers and unveils their own original tunes. Together since 2017, they continue to light up local venues, outdoor parties, and all-night jams. The pandemic didn't slow them down - it just meant that street corners and riverbanks formed the stages they played on. The TSCH is happy to welcome them for their third appearance, which will include contrabassist Nanda Wubs.
